Answer Key

Understanding the Character: The Junk Seller, Kiran, felt proud and determined about her job. Despite the social stigma associated with her work, she believed in its potential and worked hard to make it successful.

Basic Arithmetic: Profit per item = Selling Price - Cost Price = ₹5 - ₹3 = ₹2. For 5 items, total profit = $5 \times ₹2 = ₹10$.

Answer: ₹10

Critical Analysis: One challenge Kiran faced was social stigma, as people labelled her work as 'dirty business'. She overcame this by staying determined, focusing on her work, and eventually improving her living standards, which changed people's perceptions.

Financial Concepts: A loan is borrowed money that needs to be paid back, usually with interest. The Junk Seller might need a loan to start or expand her business, buy more inventory, or cover other business expenses.

Application of Concepts: Kiran's earning = End of day amount - (Start of day amount - Expense) = ₹150 - (₹100 - ₹60) = ₹150 - ₹40 = ₹110.

Answer: ₹110

Imaginative Exercise: [This answer would be subjective, reflecting a day in the life of Kiran, including buying and selling junk, interacting with customers, and managing her shop.]

Reflective Question: Education was important for the Junk Seller as it helped her in managing her business effectively, especially the use of mathematics for financial transactions and making informed decisions.

Vocabulary: An 'entrepreneur' is a person who starts and runs a business, taking on financial risks with the hope of profit. Kiran fits this definition as she started her own junk shop, managed its operations, and took financial risks to make it successful.
